The staff of the Office of Institutional Research, Assessment and Planning is pleased to present the *Fall 2008 & Fall 2009 District Ward Student Enrollment Profile Report*. The District Ward Student Enrollment Profile Report is issued annually to provide frequently requested statistical and programmatic data about the University of the District of Columbia and serves as a reference resource tool for the University community. Information presented in the Profile is divided into sections, as indicated in the Table of Contents, and is presented in tabular and/or graphic form. Citations of the data sources used for this Profile are also indicated. Suggestions or corrections are welcome and should be directed to the Office of Institutional Research, Assessment & Planning.

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## INTRODUCTION

This University of the District of Columbia (UDC) District Ward enrollment profile presents a comparative statistical summary of UDC students who resided in district wards during the Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 semesters. The data is broken down into segments including Wards, fulltime/part-time status, classification, gender, ethnicity, age, degree objectives and by College/Schools.

### **1. Enrollment by District of Columbia Ward**

Table 1 below shows the number of UDC students who reported living in District of Columbia wards for the Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 semesters. Eight hundred and seventy four (874) students or slightly over 25% of DC residents lived in Ward 4 during the Fall 2008 semester, decreasing slightly to 24.8% in Fall 2009. However, there was a net increase of 5.6% raising the total ward headcount to 926 students in Fall 2009. Ward 7 had the second highest enrollment with 813 students, or 23.5% in Fall 2008 which increased to almost 25% in Fall 2009. Ward 1 (477) and Ward 5 (465) had the third and fourth largest enrollment numbers for Fall semester 2008. In Fall 2009, all wards except ward 3 experienced enrollment increases. Ward 2, the least populous ward, experienced the highest percentage point increase at 25%, followed by Wards 8 and 7 with a 15.6% and 12.6% increases respectively. Overall, District of Columbia residents experienced a 7.3% increase in enrollment from Fall 2008 to Fall 2009.

## **2. Full-Time and Part-Time Enrollment by Attendance and Ward**

Table 2 below presents data on fulltime/part-time student enrollment by ward. In Fall 2008, Wards 4 (364) and 7 (334) had the largest numbers of fulltime students. However, 58.9%, or 479 of Ward 7 total enrollment was part-time, as was 58.1% or 510 of Ward 4 total enrollment. The data for Fall 2009 is comparable to Fall 2008 with similar increases in student enrollments; however, Ward 3 experienced a 7.4% increase in full-time students while Ward 6 experienced a 3.8% decrease in full-time students.

### 3. Enrollment by District of Columbia Ward and Classification

Tables 3a below presents Fall 2008 data by student classification and District of Columbia ward. Tables 3b below presents Fall 2009 data by student classification and District of Columbia ward. Tables 3c below presents comparative data for District of Columbia residents for Fall 2008 and Fall 2009.

Nearly 60% of district residents in Fall 2008 were classified as Sophomores or below with 2,066 students enrolled as First time Entering Freshmen, Freshmen and Sophomores.

Table 3b shows that 62.4% of district residents in Fall 2009 were classified as Sophomores or below with 2,330 students enrolled as First time Entering Freshmen, Freshmen and Sophomores for an increase of 2.8% or 264 students.

#### 4. Enrollment by Ward and Gender

Table 4 shows that female students continued to enroll in higher numbers than male students in every ward. However, female students in Wards 7 and 8 have surpassed 70% with Ward 7 female students increasing from 70.8% in Fall 2008 to 73.1% in Fall 2009. Female student enrollment in Ward 8 increased by slightly less than 1%; however it had 75% female enrollment in both terms.

### 5. Enrollment by Ethnicity and Ward

Tables 5a and 5b present student enrollment by ethnicity for Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 semesters. Black students represented the largest ethnic group for all wards with the notable exception in Ward 3 where White students constituted 40.7% of the students in Fall 2008 and Blacks accounted for 27.5%. Fall 2009 showed a similar pattern; however, there was a spike in the number of students whose ethnic identity was unspecified. The number of unspecified students increased by 16% moving from 4.8% in Fall 2008 to 20.8% in Fall 2009.

## 6. Enrollment by Ethnicity

Table 6 presents student enrollment by ethnicity for Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 semesters. Black students represented the largest ethnic group for both terms. In Fall 2008, Blacks made up 79.2% of the student body and declined to 67.4% of the total enrollment for Fall 2009. Asian students accounted for 2.2 % in Fall 2008 and declined to 1.8% in Fall 2009. Hispanic students constituted 7.7% and 6.0% for the Fall 2008 and 2009, respectively. White students accounted for 6.1% of the total enrollment for Fall 2008 and decreased to 3.9% for Fall 2009. It is significant to note that district residents who listed “other” as their ethnicity increased from 4.8% in Fall 2008 to 20.8% in Fall 2009.

## 7. Enrollment by Ward and Age Group

Tables 7a and 7b show student enrollment by age-group for both Fall 2008 and Fall 2009. Wards 4 and 7 had the highest percentage of the students enrolled in the 25-29 age group, followed by the 22-24 age group. The 20-21 age groups also had significant numbers and Ward 7 experienced a significant gain in its less than 18 year old group in Fall 2009 going from 38 students to 63.

## 8. Enrollment by Age Group

Table 8 shows student enrollment by age-group for both Fall 2008 and Fall 2009. The highest percentage of students were in the 25-29 age group, followed by the 22-24 age group. The 25-29 age group accounted for 18% and 18.5% of the total enrollment for the Fall 2008 and 2009 terms, respectively.

### 9. Enrollment by Ward and Degree Objective

Tables 9a and 9b show an increase in Associate degree seeking students in all Wards. There was a corresponding decrease in Baccalaureate degree seeking students in all Wards with the notable exceptions in Wards 2 and 8. In addition to the increase in students seeking Associate degrees, there was a similar increase in the other/undeclared student with a spike of 78 students in Ward 7. Students pursuing Masters Degrees were relatively stable.

Table 9c shows a 51.7% increase in students seeking Associate degrees, a 12.9% decline in students seeking Baccalaureate degrees and a 20.2% decline in students seeking Masters Degrees. There was also a 54.4% increase undeclared students.

### 10. Enrollment by College/School and Ward

Table 10a shows that nearly 70% of all Ward residents were enrolled in College of Arts and Sciences degree programs, almost 21% in the School of Business & Public Administration, 8.6 in the School of Engineering, with 1.7% undeclared. Table 10b shows a decline in all College/Schools and a corresponding increase in student enrollment with 34.2% of the students enrolled in the Community College.
