Washington, D.C. — leadership of the University of the District of Columbia formally thanked former District Councilmember Kevin P. Chavous for his leadership, dedication and distinguished service to the University while serving as Chairman of the Council's Education Committee and councilmember from Ward 7. The chairman of the University's Board of Trustees, Professor Charles J. Ogletree, Jr., and University President William L. Pollard cited Mr. Chavous' leadership and vision as critical elements to the success of the only public university in the nation's capital.

In presenting a plaque of appreciation to Mr. Chavous, Chairman Ogletree reflected that steadfast support was critical in seeing the University through difficult times. "(He) was always there for us," said Ogletree.
